


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To my fellow Sisters of the Northeast District,

HELPING, SUPPORTING, AND PROMOTING ALL SISTERS

- Monthly Meetings with Chapter Presidents:
 - Continue monthly NED Chapter President Meetings that were started this year.
 - New: Have them be workshop based with topics, educational pieces, and group discussions that will hopefully give President's new knowledge and resources to bring back to their Chapter.
 - Example Workshops: creating transition materials, communication with your E-Board and Chapter, creating leadership opportunities for your Chapter, building an identity in your band program, and helping Presidents make workshops to host for their own Chapter.
- Office Hours:
 - Have office hours that are available to be scheduled by appointment multiple times a week via my online calendar on <u>calendly.com</u>
 - Encourage the other members of the NED Council to also offer this resource on the NED website.
- Transition Materials
 - Give an outline to Chapters on transition materials documents that can be easily filled out by <u>any</u> leadership position and offer assistance if needed.
 - It is crucial now more than ever that every Chapter has in-depth transition materials when transitioning into a new leadership team.
 - Some Chapters may have no one or very few people who have done certain in-person service events and programs. We need to ensure we are leaving our Sisters in a better place by giving them the resources to know what to do.
- Help Chapters Transitioning into New Leadership Roles Find Their Footing
 - Offer workshops and create outlines for Chapters to be able to fill out on goal-setting, planning, and creating a timeline whether that is on an individual or Chapter level.
 - Emphasize the importance of planning over the summer so Chapters can hit the ground running at band camp
- Presidential One on One's:
 - If elected, I plan to meet with every Chapter President for about 20-30 minutes (unless they would like to stay and chat), before their E-Board has their Chapter Check-In with the District Council.
 - The main purpose is not to talk about business but more so to get to know them, build a personal connection with them, and hopefully establish a sense of trust and desire to reach out to me as a resource.
 - Ask questions about them, their college, their band, and their Chapter. I want to be able to understand them as individuals and by extension their Chapters without focusing on what needs to be "fixed".
 - Take this opportunity to explain how Chapter Check-Ins work so that E-Board members will know what to expect when meeting with the District Council.
 - Presidential one on one's will also be open to anyone else in the District who would like to chat and have the opportunity to get to know each other!
 - It's extremely important to have a personal connection with at least one person per Chapter so that there is more familiarity and connection between Chapters and the District Council.
 - Encourage each District Council member to do a similar 1 on 1 system with their prospective counterparts.

- Build Confidence in Chapters by Establishing Their Identity in Their Band Program
 - Help Chapters establish yearly service events, programs, and events that they host for their band every year.
 - This will more concretely establish an identity and place for them in their band program which will not only strengthen operations but also make them more seen by their fellow band members and by extension indirect recruitment.
- Create More Leadership Opportunities on the Chapter Level
 - If Chapters are large enough to have Sisters with no "official" title, help Chapters create opportunities for them to still develop leadership skills.
 - This can be by either developing new positions, having every Sister take on a project on behalf of the Chapter, or by letting Sisters try their hand at a job that would be traditionally done by an E-Board member.
- Continue to Focus on Developing Sister's Hard and Soft Skills That Can Be Used Outside of Tau Beta Sigma
 - Give resources to Sisters on how to create a resume, how to get clearances for schools (useful for Crescendo), and other tangible skills that can be used on a Chapter level but also are useful for a Sister's professional life.

PRECINCT MEETINGS AND NEDCON!

- Make Precinct Meetings More Tailored to Each Precinct
 - By focusing on getting to know each Chapter and understanding their strengths and weaknesses, I want to find trends between Precincts and be able to customize and put together different workshops for each Precinct Meeting that as a Council we feel would benefit the Chapters in attendance the most.
- Higher and Equal Attendance at District Convention
 - Not only have more people in attendance, but have more equal representation of attendees across Chapters.
- Start hosting meetings and presentations on running for District Council before Precinct Meeting
 - Host multiple sessions over Winter Break and January so that interested parties can meet with District Council members sooner, get a head start on their packet, and have the opportunity to ask more in depth questions and even have the District Council look through the rough stages of their packet at Precinct Meeting.
- Dedicate time to get to know people from other Chapters at NEDCon
 - This can be from dedicating an hour to intermingling between Chapters, have people only sit next to people outside of their Chapter (or outside of their Precinct), or having partner-based activities where Sisters will be partnered up with someone outside of their Chapter.
- Setting the Example by Doing Service for Our Community Outside of Tau Beta Sigma
 - Work with Community Relations Personnel on the National level and see if the District Council can present to bands with no service organization in the Northeast District how they can serve their band program. If the band program leaves inspired to start their own TBSigma Chapter great, but if not then we at least helped a band program out by encouraging their students to serve.

JOINT RELATIONS

- Joint District Events
 - Continue to encourage the joint councils and VPSPs to host socials and programs for the entire NED throughout the year.
 - Encourage Chapters to attend with their own respective KKPsi Chapter if applicable.
- Encourage Joint Bonding on the Chapter Level
 - If a Chapter has a KKPsi Chapter, or any other music service organization, encourage them to have joint e-board meetings on monthly-semesterly basis.

GOALS FOR THE NED COUNCIL

- <u>Promote District and National Awards</u>
 - Host a workshop with tips and tricks to applying for awards.
 - Encourage Chapters to assign one person in their Chapter as a point of contact and whose responsibility is to spearhead awards.
 - Create a checklist for each award to help Chapters keep track of what they need to do to complete their application (letters of recommendation, essay, etc.)
 - Assist the Sec-Treas in getting the awards up on the website as soon as possible so Chapters have more time to work on and complete them.
- District Council One on One's
 - Have a One on One with each District Council Member in May to discuss what their goals are and what their timeline for that is.
 - Figure out how I can support them through the upcoming term and ensure that they can pursue all of their passion projects.
- Chapter Meeting Visits
 - Have at least one member of the NED Council visit one Chapter meeting per Chapter as a way to get to know one another and bond.
- <u>MC Lesson Visits</u>
 - Have at least one member of the NED Council visit the Overture Lesson on the NED so that MCs can connect a face to the name they are learning about.
- <u>Meet the Council Events</u>
 - Host events for over the summer for anyone who wants to come hang out, play games, and get to know the people who are serving them on the District level.
- NED Council Slack
 - Create a slack for the NED Council, Counselors, CVAs, etc. to be able to more easily transfer information to one another and have a standard form of communication.
