
NORTHEAST DISTRICT VICE PRESIDENT OF MEMBERSHIP CANDIDACY PACKET

Matthew Badia (he/him) Tau Beta Sigma Iota Alpha – Marist College






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Sisters and Brothers of the Northeast District,

It is an honor to write to the district as a candidate for office on the Northeast District Council. This has been a goal of mine since first learning about District Councils during Membership Candidate Lessons. My collegiate band experience has been a service, holding many positions in my Chapter and the Band. I knew serving on District Council would be the best way to continue my service to my Chapter and all the Chapters of the Northeast District.

A Sister of Tau Beta Sigma for three years, I have served as Secretary on the elected Executive Board of the Marist College Band and as chapter Vice President of Membership for one year. In addition, I served on the Women in Music Committee and as Chapter Parliamentarian. In my capacity as Secretary of Bands, I am responsible for membership attendance at all band functions. Additionally, I am responsible for note-taking during meetings, communication with general members, and organization of the band's documents. During my time on the Women in Music committee, we organized and hosted a panel of the women in the Marist Music Department on which the Director of Choir and Director of Orchestra sat. This event's goal was to introduce the Marist Music Department to its leadership and share with the department the struggles of women making a career in music.

My time as Chapter Vice President of Membership was more tumultuous. Assuming my position in the middle of the COVID Crisis, I had to rework the existing MC lessons and activities to a virtual setting. I successfully planned and implemented a virtual recruitment week taking in Iota Alpha's Alpha Alpha Class. Virtual MC lessons proved challenging but not insurmountable. The Alpha Alpha Class completed the MC process despite the challenges of a pandemic. At the time of writing this, I am preparing for yet another virtual recruitment week with virtual socials and virtual service events.

Outside of the chapter, Iota Alpha and Kappa Upsilon of KKY hosted the 2019 Northern Precinct Meeting. Additionally, I served as an alternate delegate for the Delta Omega chapter at the 2019 National Convention in Stillwater, Oklahoma. At National Convention, I served on the Programs Committee, where improvements to CODA, Focus on Five, and Greater Practice. On the District Level, I participated in Fall Focus Groups for COVID recruitment and membership. I served on the Project Peace of Mind Taskforce to help revise POM. Most recently, I attended the Virtual NED Precincts Meeting. This experience has helped me to prepare for District Leadership.

To serve the needs of others is one of the greatest honors one can have. Membership in Tau Beta Sigma provides a pathway to service to bandmembers across the nation. The education of Membership Candidates is vital for a chapter's continued success. However, membership education does not stop after the MC process; rather, it is designed to continue during a Sister's membership in Tau Beta Sigma. As my time as an undergraduate comes to an end, I feel a need to continue my service to my Sisters. As District VPM, I will continue to support chapters and
