SECTION THREE: COUNSELOR'S REPORT

Nicole Kemp, NED Counselor, presented the Counselor's Report as a powerpoint presentation during Separates Session. The following is the written report.

Greetings friends,

You have heard from each of your District Officers their accounts of all of the projects and programs, successes and challenges, that they have worked through this term. They talked about how they served you as a district, and how they worked with each chapter to create a better and stronger #onened. I am here now to share with you the spirit and zeitgeist of the term.

We had been given a Vision Statement by the district, one that you as a district voted on, one that outlined a dream of where we as a district would be in 20 years. This council focused their energies on that vision and all that it encompassed. It was a large task, and they were dreaming quite big, but I do believe that they feel as though they have made significant headway in the dreams of this district and have laid substantial groundwork for future councils to build upon. The council had also been handed a set of goals that supported the vision, and were charged with creating action plans and goals for their offices that aligned with the larger goals of the council. This methodology for achievement has proven to be a successful way to set a goal and to work through the goal to the vision. You all by now have seen our district website - tbsned.org. The website is now more than static information sharing, it is a hub for communication. It allows you all to post and interact with the council, engaging in the ongoings of the district and of other chapters. You can share ideas in our new electronic database system the Activity Forums, which is beautiful because many of our committee charges involve some sort of activity or project database. Further, I get requests each year from members wanting to get to know the MEPs in other chapters, and the Activity Forums are ways that you can share all of that information with one another. On our website you can learn about district history, or use our calendar to remember all of your deadlines. As our engaging website became stronger, our need for an email listserv became less. In the coming year we expect that the website will allow you to filter information and follow that information, electing to have it sent directly to you should you prefer email communication. This website combines the efforts of all previous communication hubs, and we're looking forward to the future of what we are able to do. In the interim, our facebook groups and pages were a hit this year. Our officer groups became a medium for discussion and support. Our joint group became a way for us to celebrate our Brothers and share ideas with them as well. Our NED Photo Page group was one of the biggest hits of the year, offering everyone a chance to celebrate the diversities in our members and chapters and get to know one another as people.

This year we also worked to structure the training and development of our district officers, and to pass on this structure to you all as well. Through structured information sharing, one-on-one goals setting, personal check-ins, one on ones, and evaluations, our officers were kept very accountable this year and they worked very hard to keep you all accountable as well.

One thing that I think that they all learned was that communication is only successful if it is received properly - and that you all need to be communicated with in different ways. They worked really hard to reach out to you when they thought you might need and extra push, and sometimes we used friends and allies to help. We recognize that many chapters in the NED are small - some of you are doing two or three offices at a time, and so we don't take offense when you don't participate in every project or discussion. The goal is for us to work in ways that help you, and sometimes that meant asking chapters around the district to reach out and help you when we couldn't reach you. It's great to see such heightened correspondence efforts this year - with chapters reaching out to one another, pen pals both individual and chapter wide, the letter exchange, and of course our new District social events, Precinct Days.

With every great term, as we all know, comes challenges. There were many challenges this term both on council and challenges that you all faced. You all keep my email box and cell phone quite busy, and while I am always sorry for the challenges that arise I am always thrilled to help you work through them. Our district is one that works to not only help one another through the challenges, but to challenge ourselves to work harder and smarter - to meet these challenges in the middle, overcoming them and moving forward. As you each face challenges in your personal lives, on your councils, or in your chapters, face them with no regrets, working through the Tau Beta Sigma ideals to prescribe the answers to your challenges. Sisters of the Northeast District,

What I'd like you to think about during my final report is what you have done in the past year and what direction you are headed when you get back to campus. What have you learned this weekend that you can directly apply to your bands, academics, and life? How will you improve? That is the whole purpose of why we come together for these Conventions.

I set high goals this year for myself as President, for the Council, and for progress within the District. During the District Leadership Convention in Orlando in July the following goals were set out in an action plan for the year - improved communication, leadership development and socialization, and program development.

The large goals for improving communication were centralization of information, facilitating discussion between Sisters in similar offices, and building our resources. This was done through a complete overhaul of tbsned.org, hosting Officer Chats online and Round Table discussions at Precinct Meetings, and involving National Council in our activities and Committees. Each of these initiatives brought Sisters closer to one another - physically and virtually - and established a strong communication base that has been expanded on in terms of quality throughout the year.

An important component of our organization is that we develop as leaders through our participation. As Sisters gain more experience in TBS they take on new roles. It is equally important that we get to know one another, and our Brothers, in and out of the Bond. At each Precinct Meeting we had a number of Sisters and Chapters present workshops ranging from Project Protect Music to Communication to Leadership and provided opportunities for Sisters and MCs to meet one another outside of a business setting. As a Joint Council we worked to expand District Days and facilitate multiple events throughout the year in different areas of our District. This comes from the idea that we make the best connections when we are in person with one another - that type of interaction is what I want to see promoted in the future. I created the Vision and Direction Task Force to have continuous discussion about the goals and initiatives of the NED and provide an opportunity for Sisters to participate at the District level throughout the year. It has been exciting to see how these programs are taken on by our Chapters and to hear how the programs are

growing.

The Council and I set out six goals for the incoming Council to take on and continue to work toward the long-terms goals of the NED. In order for any of these goals to be achieved we must each take ownership of them and of the District. My hope for the upcoming term is that you each do something to improve yourself. Improve in your service – push for evaluation of projects and strategic planning. Improve as leaders – step up into a new position, lead a project or fundraiser, take on a challenge. Improve as musicians – host a recital for your Chapter, get together for an hour a week with another Sister to practice, learn about a new style you've never played before. Improve as Sisters. Reach out to one another. Learn. Grow. That is my challenge and hope for all of you and for the future of the NED.

Sisters of the Northeast District,

It is with great honor that I present to you my final report for the 2012-2013 year. Looking back at the year we had, I cannot believe how far each and every one of us has come. As I stand here before you today, I stand with the highest of hopes for this District, because if any year was a test of how much we can withstand and fight through, it was this year.

When I became Alumni Secretary/Historian, I soon realized how much work had to be done in only this one short year. Within weeks after convention I had developed a timeline with the help of my fellow council members, and decided that the goal of the year was to make everything digital and public. The first thing I did was digitize all of the scrapbooks and yearbooks that were given to me at the 2012 convention and put them on the NED website. This included scrapbooks from as far back as a 1979 National Convention. Throughout the year, I was able to do some digging and made the following information accessible on our website: past to present District Convention Sites, Precinct Sites, Council Members, and founding information of every single chapter in this District. I also made a District Family Tree, so that all chapters can easily view their origins.

To go along with online social media I also created and monitored the Tau Beta Sigma Northeast District Photo Page. It was a slow-starting page at first, but as the year progressed, more and more chapters started using this page to share chapter activities and much more. Not only was this a fun and easy way of documenting history, this was also a way to strengthen our District. To be able to support one another from afar is something that is hard to do, but not for us. From this page, I also created six slide shows that have been shown from the beginning to end of convention.

This year I also started the monthly History Quizzes and the monthly Alumni Secretary/Historian chats. The quizzes not only made chapters work as a group on something, but it also encouraged chapters to become more familiar with the NED website and the National website. The monthly chats were a way for me to get to know the Alumni Secretaries/ Historians of the District, and was also a way for them to get to know one another and bounce ideas off of each other.

Another new feature this year is the Counselors Corner on the NED website. Through the help of others on Council I was able to reach out to past Counselors and ask them a series of questions to answer about their time as Counselor. Not only was this an amazing experience for me to be able to talk to this amazing leaders, but it is a great way of documenting what was memorable to them then and what is memorable to us now.

This will be the second year that the NED will have a yearbook. Through the help of all my fellow council members, and chapters in this amazing District I was able to complete an amazing book that helps keep our history alive. For the first time, it will be uploaded to the website so everyone can see it.

This year was also the first year in over three years that there has been a District History Project. It was a two part project: the first part involved chapters introducing themselves (from the beginning to end, the good, the bad and the ugly.) During the second part, the challenge was to describe where they wanted to go as a chapter and future chapter growth. Chapters also had to pick one or two people that truly represented the 5 and the 8 and the ideals of Tau Beta Sigma. These projects would then be displayed at District Convention for all chapters to see.

This year was a catch-up year for the Office of Alumni Secretary/Historian, and I believe the office has finally caught up with the times. I charge the next Alumni Secretary/Historian to not only continue monthly quizzes, chats, gathering more information regarding past District Award winners, slide shows,

yearbooks and others, but to also conduct extensive outreach. It is now time for Alumni to shine. Get contact information right away so that we can always keep sisters informed on what and how we are doing as a District.

I would now like to take this time to thank some people, without whom I would not have survived this year. First and foremost is Kat Tribulski, NEDAA VP for Tau Beta Sigma. Thank you for all your advice, wisdom, and knowledge on everything. Secondly, I would like to thank this District council and Nicole. Thank you for all you have done for me as an officer, sister, and friend. Thank you. I would also like to thank Aaron Moore, Alumni Historical and Development Coordinator from National Headquarters, for always answering all my emails and questions so quickly. I would also like to take the time to thank Nick Valinski for not only dealing with me and the rest of council, but for taking the time and teaching others how to use our website. It is such an important tool for not only general use, but for also documenting history. So for this, I thank you. My last thank is to you, my fellow sisters. I know there were times I was bombarding you with quizzes, chats, projects and more, but you took all of those things and made them your own. You helped raise the bar of not only what is expected of you, but also what is expected of me and my fellow officers.

If I could leave you with one last bit of advice, this is it: take too many photos, laugh a lot, and always be there for your sisters through good times and bad ones. Because the memories you make today will be with you for the rest of your life.

3.403 The responsibilities for the District Vice President of Membership shall be as follows: a. To work with the Tau Beta Sigma National Vice President for Colonization and Membership and the District Vice President of Kappa Kappa Psi towards expansion within the District.

b. To administer all programs concerning membership education.

c. To serve as advisor to the Expansion and Membership Committee.

d. To notify chapters semi-annually regarding colonization processes within the District.

The Vice President of Membership is also responsible for communicating dates of colony

degrees to all chapters within the District at least two (2) weeks prior to the degree.

e. To collect and review chapter Membership Education Packets for input and future reference.

8.201 The Expansion/Membership Committee shall be responsible for the continual development of membership education according to the national guidelines, and addresses issues regarding membership education at the Chapter and District Levels. This committee will also be charged with discussing possibilities for expansion, identifying potential locations for new colonies and assisting current colonies with issues pertinent to them. At the discretion of the committee chair and advisor, the committee may split into and Expansion subcommittee and a Membership subcommittee in order to accomplish the goals set forth. The Expansion subcommittee may meet jointly with the Expansion Committee of Kappa Psi as necessary.

This is handy and makes sure it is written down on paper so you can accomplish all of your goals and work on continuity from year to year. This is also used for the National Council to check that all chapters are working towards our goals and ideals.
- The MEP should not be made just by the VPM; Membership concerns everyone. The chapter should all be involved.
- This is not just for the New Membership Program it can also contain things for Post Membership etc. We are working for continuity.

Win-Win Membership Drive

- Rewarding chapters that increase their membership. For every 10% increase in your membership you get an entry into a drawing for a free delegate fee! You can have an entry for each membership class!
- This starts now! After this Districts, 3/22/2013 you can submit for next year's District Convention

Sisterhood Week

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The Precincts were charged with participating by submitting a picture on the NED Photo Page each day leading up to NEDCon2013 according to the themes laid out. This contributed to the Spirit Award and gave chapters/members who weren't able to attend NEDCon2013 a way to participate. The Days were:

As a committee we reviewed the district and national constitutions and we found that no changes needed to be made

National Constitution

5.303 A Committee on Nominations a teach District Convention shall carefully investigate the eligibility of candidates for election. The committee shall nominate on member for each office and present the names to the Convention. Additional nominations may be made from the floor of the Convention by Official Delegates. The Nominations Committee shall determine the eligibility of any other candidates who are nominated from the floor. A majority of all votes cast shall be necessary for election.

District Constitution

8.204 The Nominations Committee shall investigate the eligibility of all candidates for election to the offices of District President, District Vice President of Membership, District Vice President of Special Projects, District Secretary, District Alumni Secretary and Historian, and District Treasurer. The Nominations Committee may nominate no more than one (1) person for each office and shall present this slate of names to the Convention. Nominations Committee shall also investigate the eligibility of candidates nominated from the floor during elections. Nominations shall be a closed committee.

After reviewing the district and national constitutions we did not find any changes to be presented to the Jurisdiction Committees.

2. This is the first time for the NED council to require all platforms to be submitted on the tbsned.org website one week ahead of District Convention. Also the first year that we had nominations meet during a working lunchtime. Carefully investigate eligibility of candidates for election. At this time the committee advises to continue having candidates submit platforms a week before convention

- How do you plan on dealing with chapter's diversities, and how will you understand those diversities to make them comfortable with you?

Secretary:

-How do you plan on working to improve joint relations and encouraging joint relations within chapters?

- How would you use social media to communicate within the district?

Alumni Secretary/Historian:

-How do you plan on working to improve alumni relations within chapters?

- How would you encourage chapters to work on their alumni program?

- What do you plan on doing to preserve our district? How would you help chapters to preserve/know/ keep their history?

- How would you continue to preserve and make accessible our history?

4. We also Conducted the meet-the-candidates session as charged.

Time was allotted during the convention for a designated Meet-the-Candidates session. We also encouraged all candidates to take it upon themselves to meet with chapters individually to discuss their platforms.

5. Interview all candidates found eligible.

We interviewed all the candidates in ten-minute interviews. One minute was used to explain the process to the candidate. Each member of the committee, the chair and the advisor asked a question and the candidate had 1 minute to answer. The remaining 2 minutes were used for follow up questions and anything the candidate felt they wanted to say.

Alumni and Historical Affairs

The 2013 Alumni Affairs Committee was charged with the following:

- 1. Discussion on how to communicate with alumni (activities, ideas, etc.)
- 2. Review NEDAA and any new activities
- 3. Review projects of the Alumni Secretary/Historian
- 4. Create a list of ideas for promotion/education/increase incentives of life membership, NEDAA, TB Σ AA and other alumni associations and charge that list to the incoming officer.
- 5. Review alumni and history workshops at precincts and district convention and determine their effectiveness; brainstorm ideas for future workshops

Throughout our discussion, we discovered that many chapters communicate differently with their alumni. Some chapters throughout the district use email list-servs, Facebook groups and even a phone tree to communicate with the alumni has proved to be effective. We decided that if it works for the chapter, use it. We discussed activities that each chapter does with their alumni, ideas that were discussed include: alumni picnics, alumni weekend activities, potlucks, and charter week activities. We agreed that when free food is involved, more people would feel more inclined to attend the activities.

We had a very in depth conversation about NEDAA and what they have provided for us in the past year. The NEDAA projects include the Keynote Speaker and the Ritual Scholarship, which had great success this year. We found the Keynote Speech by a Theta Phi Sister to be fantastic. It was revealed that there were not many submissions for the Ritual Scholarship and the winners received replacement books, which will update that chapter's ritual. We believe that with more promotion by NEDAA and the next Alumni Secretary and Historian we believe that there will be more submissions. We also talked about the near future projects that NEDAA will be promoting, which include the National Intercollegiate Band Scholarship and the National Convention Delegate Scholarship. Those will be advertised after District Convention is over. The main concern that the committee had was the fact that not many people are aware that these awards exist. We would like the next Alumni Secretary and Historian to work with the District Webmaster to create a page designated for the Alumni, NEDAA and TB Σ AA.

These are the projects of the 2012-2013 NED Alumni Secretary and Historian:

- 1. Made all the scrapbooks and yearbook online
- 2. Made a NED Family Tree
- 3. Made A Chapter Information Page
- 4. Made A NED History Page
- 5. Made a up-to-date list of all past council members and Counselors
- 6. Made monthly history Quizzes
- 7. Held Monthly Chats
- 8. Came up with a History Project

- 9. Made a yearbook
- 10. Made Slideshows
- 11. Interviewed past Counselors and created a Counselors Corner on the website
- 12. Made a data base of Past Precinct Sites and Convention Sites
- 13. Made a TBS NED Photo Page on Facebook

Overall, as a committee, we are incredibly impressed with the amount of work that Billy Ray Poli has put into the office. We discussed each project and whether or not we believe that the project can be improved on or whether the next Alumni Secretary and Historian has to keep updating the material. One project that does not need to be continued is the digitalization of the scrapbooks and yearbooks, Billy Ray was able to get everything on the tbsned.org website. We talked about having the next Alumni Secretary and Historian continually updating: NED History page, list of all past council members and Counselors, he database of Past Precinct Sites. We discussed that we would like to see more creative ways to display our history with our main example of having the next Alumni Secretary and Historian to create an actual tree diagram of the NED Family Tree, the current one looks a little boring. We discussed the possible idea of having the next Alumni Secretary and Historian try to collect former bids for Precinct Meetings and District Conventions. Our reasoning behind this would be to help chapters who want to host be able to look back if their chapter hosted in the past. We believe that all projects listed above (except for the digitalization of scrapbooks and yearbooks) should continue with the next Alumni Secretary and Historian but some changes to those projects can be found in the new set of charges.

When we began to discuss Life Membership, the cost was a big part of the discussion. Unfortunately, there is nothing we could do with the cost of Life Membership. We can only provide incentives for people to purchase life membership. We discussed the rights that are afforded to Life Members. It is commonly unknown to Life Members that they have certain rights. We would like to see the next Alumni Secretary and Historian work with the District Webmaster to create a "Know Your Rights" page on tbsned.org designated towards the promotion of purchasing Life Membership. We also talked about possibly having the district create a fund where chapters can donate money towards having multiple Life Membership Scholarships. We would like the next Alumni Secretary and Historian work with the District Treasurer and District VPSP to create multiple scholarships for Life Membership. These scholarships can be full scholarships or partial scholarships; that would be to the discretion of the District Council. We would also like to see chapters start their own fund towards a full or partial scholarship for Life Membership. Our reasoning behind this is that there are so many deserving Sisters in our District, we would like to recognize as many as we can.

When we talked about NEDAA and TB Σ AA, we found that a lot of members on the committee didn't know much about the organizations, we focused on one idea which is having the Alumni Secretary and Historian collect bi-monthly news articles/updates from NEDAA and TB Σ AA to include in Turtle Talk,

the District Council's monthly publication. This way, the NED is able to read what is going on with these organizations on a regular basis.

The workshops at District Conventions and the Precinct Meetings were the following:

Kat Tribulski's Alumni Presentation - Precinct Meetings

NEDAA Luncheon - District Convention

"Stop and Go" Ritual Workshop - District Convention

We believe that Kat's Alumni workshop was incredibly informative about how to handle alumni. We liked that it covered all aspects, even the bad (because sometimes the bad is inevitable).

The purpose of the NEDAA Luncheon is to bring all graduating seniors into one place and discuss the benefits of being a member of NEDAA, this way, everyone is in the same place at the same time not being distracted by other business, it is during a lunch block.

The "Stop and Go" Ritual Workshop was a great way for Sisters to ask questions throughout ritual and ask questions as we went through. Sue Carr and Jonathan Markowski presented this workshop. They covered how ritual used to be like and compared it to how we perform our ritual now. Chapters were able to discuss about their traditions.

What we mainly talked about in this discussion was the fact that there were not many workshops on Alumni and History topics. We would like to see the District Council hold at least one workshop with regards to Alumni topics and one workshop with regards to History topics in the Spring of 2014. We would prefer these workshops to be run by Active members, this gets chapters involved and have the ability to compare and contrast on how other chapters operate in the Alumni and History areas. This way, chapters can learn from each other.

The Alumni Affairs committee charges the 2013-2014 NED Alumni Secretary and Historian with the following:

- 1. Reach out to NEDAA and TB Σ AA for bi-monthly updates to include in Turtle Talk.
- 2. Create a tab on the District Website to promote the education of TB Σ AA, NEDAA and Life Membership
- 3. Create a digital NED Family Tree
- 4. Work with the NED Webmaster to get every chapter's historical and current information on the District website.

- 5. Keep the following pages up to date:
 - a. NED History Page
 - b. Past Council Members and Counselors
 - c. Past Precinct Sites
 - d. Past Convention Sites
- 6. Continue Monthly NED History Quizzes which will now include Joint Questions and also promote these quizzes through the use of the TBSNED Official Facebook Page, Twitter Handle, Email, Facebook Groups, and District Website
- 7. Continue with the NED History Project and choose a topic.
- 8. Hold more chats for different purposes (for example, work with the District VPM to have a History Based Candidate Chat)
- 9. Work with the Kappa Kappa Psi NED Historian/Alumni Liaison to create a Joint Yearbook
- 10. Create one or multiple slideshows showing the recent year to be displayed at District Convention
- 11. Assign Active Sisters as "official photographers" for any District Events and create a place for all pictures to be uploaded to.
- 12. Gather past bids for Precinct Meetings and District Conventions to distribute in the case that a chapter would like to look at previous bids.
- 13. Create a standing committee to assist with any of these charges if he or she so chooses.

This committee may meet jointly with the Committee on Alumni Affairs of Kappa Kappa Psi. The committee will discuss benefits and challenges that chapters experience with their alumni and brainstorm ways to maintain healthy relationships with all alumni.

Rationale:

8.207: The word undergraduate should be removed because there are graduate students that are Active. Other changes reflect current practice and aim at providing clarity for how the Committee can work to improve alumni relations within the District. For now on this committee will be called the alumni and historical affairs.

Sisterhood And Spirit Committee

Original:

8.208 The Sisterhood and Spirit Committee will discuss ways to increase unity and sisterhood within the district through the teaching and learning of song, dance, and step. The committee will also discuss ways to improve district morale.

Proposed:

8.208 The Sisterhood and Spirit Committee will discuss ways to increase unity and sisterhood within the district through the teaching and learning of song, dance, and step. The committee will also discuss ways to improve district morale throughout the year and will review programs that are already in place that encourage the celebration of diversity of our chapters and foster intra-chapter learning opportunities. The committee will create spirit challenges for the duration of the District Convention and will recommend three exceptionally spirited chapters to the District President for the District Spirit Award.

Rationale:

8.208: Revised to reflect current practice and provide clarity for how the Committee can work to improve communication between Sisters and work toward the long-term goals of the District.

Committee Reports

Original:

10.101 The committee chairpersons shall submit sufficient copies of their respective reports to the delegates and District Council prior to the reading of their reports. The District Officers shall submit sufficient copies of their respective reports to the outgoing District Secretary prior to the reading of their reports. These reports will be distributed as follows:

a. One (1) copy to the District Counselor to be kept on file.

b. One (1) copy to each District Officer to be kept on file.

c. One (1) copy to the District Secretary to be incorporated in the convention minutes.

10.102 The District President will prepare a report regarding the entire district for submission at National Convention. If not able to attend, the report will be submitted by a designated representative.

10.103 Each chapter shall be required to submit a yearly report at the District Convention. **Proposed:**

10.101 Committee Chairpersons shall submit a report of committee activity and findings to the District Council for inclusion in the District Convention Minutes and shall give a summary of the report at District Convention.

10.102 District Officers shall submit activity reports to the District Council prior to each meeting of the District Council. Their final activity report shall be submitted for inclusion in the District Convention Minutes, and a summary of their final report shall be given at District Convention. 10.103 Each chapter shall be required to submit a yearly report at the District Convention for inclusion in the District Convention Minutes.

10.104 (was 10.102) The District President will prepare a report regarding the District for the current biennium for submission at National Convention. If not able to attend, the report will be submitted by a designated representative.

Rationale:

10.101: Revised to reflect current practice. Reports are not distributed prior to reading the summaries.

New 10.102: Revised to reflect current practice.

Special Committee: Vision and Direction

Vision and Direction:

March 22nd-23rd, 2013

Chaired by Victoria Wolk- Delta Delta

Advised by Allison Leemann- Eta Gamma, NED President '12-'13

The charges for the 2013 Vision and Direction Committee are as follows:

1. Review the NED Vision Statement as well as the National Vision and Mission Statements (for reference).

- 2. Evaluate the progress of the 2012-2013 Council.
- 3. Review the report from the Vision and Direction Task Force.
- 4. Discuss any possible changes to the Vision Statement
- 5. Review the goals set forth by the 2012-2013 Council for the 2013-2014 Council
- 6. Propose any changes or additions to the goals for the 2013-2014 Council
- 7. Discuss any suggestions for future ad hoc committees
 - 1. The committee reviewed the NED Vision Statement and National Vision and Mission Statement to guide our discussion with the ideals in mind.
 - 2. The committee discussed each initiative the council has taken on this year and determined ways in which they could be improved upon and where they would like to see these go as they were written in the Task Force Final Report.

Improved Communication:

- The committee feels that sisters who were not officers were not aware of specific ways to get involved or ways of communication. There needs to be a push to get non-officers involved as well as more of an education of how to get to all of our communication outlets.
- Implementing monthly NED student chats would be beneficial, however, the committee would like to advise that the council analyze what is going on in chapters and the district so that conversation topics are worthwhile. There should also be plenty of notice about these chats.
- In terms of getting alumni involved, there needs to be a push from NEDAA (more programs, activities, etc) in order to get alumni involved. This shouldn't be coming from the active chapters, but from the alumni themselves.
- Ways to feature a chapter's uniqueness can be having the webmaster post videos and photos of other bands and what they're doing. Some possibilities are a "did you know" page to be updated weekly about a different chapter and/or a reach out week where chapters can look at others websites to learn something new.

Leadership Development and Socialization:

- The committee would like to see other chapters continue to run workshops, however, the committee would like to see more audience involvement and more variety in the types of workshops.

- The committee would like to see precinct days continue, however, as an incentive to travel more and participate in days such as these, the committee recommends that a travel award be given.

Program Development:

- The committee would like to see the activity forums continue, with some modifications related towards advertising the forums so more sisters know about them. The committee believes this is a worthwhile program, however, they would like to see it used as more of a conversation becoming more of a useful resource. They would also like to see a fundraising forum created.
- The committee would like to see the National programs pushed in the same way the district programs are. In addition, they would like to see more Nationals Days to celebrate the Women in Music.
- 3. The Vision and Task Force Report was discussed as a whole in order to determine improvements from initiatives from the 2012-2013 council term and to determine recommendations for the 2013-2014 council term including the future of the Vision and Direction Committee.
- 4. The committee reviewed the statement "We are elite" and recommends the suggested change "Always striving to be better and stronger. One NED." The reasoning being that we are not currently at our fullest potential, but rather we should be working towards that potential over the span of which the vision statement tells us to. "We are elite" always comes off, unintentially, as a tad stuck up which is not how we would like to be viewed.
- 5. The Committee reviewed the recommendations for the 2013-2014 council and made the following comments on each recommendation:

Promote Joint initiatives and relations at both the District and Chapter level:

- The concern is that there are a lot joint initiatives and it may take away from the time we spend on only sister initiatives. Furthermore, not all chapters have good joint relations and the committee would like to make sure this taken into consideration.

Connect Chapters to learn from one another and celebrate diversity through participation in District initiatives that promote an appreciation and understanding of our differences:

- The committee believes there are plans in place and that the NED is already headed in the right direction with this. They would like to see the facebook page taken to the next step.

Provide leadership development tools that Sisters can utilize at all levels of participation:

- This goes back to giving sisters a guide on how to communicate within the District. This would ultimately give sisters the tools to voice their opinion. Furthermore, if sisters are able to communicate more they will be able to find new avenues to get involved, however, offering new ways to get involved is always a plus. The more the District is exposed to all forms of participation, the more they will be involved, but if there is no exposure there will be no involvement.

Provide learning opportunities and find avenues for all Sisters, particularly non-officers and MCs or new members, to participate in District activity:

- This is paired with the opportunities to get to know other chapters (unique specificities of the band, chapter, etc.) who can in turn be featured on the

District website. The committee would like to see more initiatives opened or advertised to MC's because the more they are exposed to things as MC's the more they will want to be involved when they become sister's, and they will know how to be involved.

Reach out and encourage Chapters who do not participate or communicate often to be involved:

- The committee would like the council to have open conversations with the chapters who do not participate to fully understand why they do not. From this point the council can make adjustments to the program seeking participation or at the very least have an understanding for the lack of participation. The committee recommends that the council suggest ways to get involved, including how to get involved, and to do so in the fall rather than the spring before everything is over. This way the chapters can build a bond with the council as well.

Find sources of funding outside the Active Chapter so the District can provide new and more opportunities to Sisters:

- The examples provided by the Task Force were sufficient. One recommendation would be to get involved with Shop for a Cause by Macy's.
- 6. All recommendations of the goals for the 2013-2014 Council have been stated previously. The committee would like to see:
 - A bigger push for how to get involved and sooner in the academic year.
 - The activity forums expanded and used as more of a conversation resource.
 - The council to understand why chapters do not participate and to adjust programs to better fulfill needs or simply understand the lack of participation.
 - More of an effort to get non-officers and MC's involved so they are aware of all forms of communication and programs therefore being exposed to everything the District has to offer.
- 7. The future of the Vision and Direction Committee was discussed and resulted in the following conclusion:

- Because the President needs feedback from the District about how the council, their initiatives, and the District are running. The committee would like to request that Jurisdiction propose the President request feedback from the Task Force on a regular interval. The President will then discuss this feedback with the council and be able to make adjustments. The Task Force will no longer be communicating "goals" to the council but rather "recommending objectives". The Task Force should continue with an open invitation to one person per chapter.

3. Spotlight certain chapters each month or semester in the Northeast Notes to support the accomplishments of our individual chapters.

2. Evaluate the progress of convention bids, resources and tools created by District Officers and how they can be improved.

A good amount of this year for Gamma Kappa has been focused on getting ready for our 50th year anniversary, which will be taking place next year. We started by creating the 50th Year Chair along with a brand new Core Committee. This committee consists of the 50th year chair, website chair, alumni liaison, historian, and President. These chairs were selected to run this committee because we believe that they each represent a crucial part of our 50th year, and its planning. We started our preparations by trying to contact the very people who got us where we are today, our alumni. We have combined our Gamma Kappa and band databases and searched social media, but our most effective alumni contact method was found by each sister trying to contact as far back in their family lines as possible. This not only boosted and refreshed our alumni database, but also gave us a much more personal and direct line to our families. From here we are planning small events and ways to give back to the band which include giving out freshman band survival kits at preseason, supplying snacks periodically during band rehearsal, hosting an ice cream social for the UCMB, and finally giving a large gift to our marching band program as a thanks and celebration of 50 years of service. We'll be kicking off our celebration with an alumni picnic at the end of this year, and are planning on a huge ball at the end of next year! Our newest push is for the establishment and execution of our newest flagship project, an annual outdoor benefit concert featuring UConn a capella and other performing groups including our very own Funky Dawgz. We hope to grow this into something in which the entire UConn community can be involved.

Overall, we at Gamma Kappa have had an amazing year, and feel as strong as ever. After bringing in two great classes, Gamma Beta (5 new members), and our current MC's Gamma Gamma (7 MC's), we only feel positivity about the direction in which our chapter is headed. We have completed projects such as trick or treating for canned good, helping with the downtown trick or treating, helping out with JazzFest and Stringposium at Bloomsburg University. During marching band season we do a lot to prepare for band camp in the summer. Jointly, we help the new freshmen move in during the beginning of move in week.

This past fall we brought in a class of three. They are a great addition to our family. This spring semester we are not taking a class, so this semester we are planning on holding a lot of bonding activities and workshops to better ourselves as individuals and sisters.

During the fall semester we made and sold 'band camp kits' and sold them during band camp. They are always a hit because they are cheap and easy to compile. One of our biggest fundraisers is selling Wolfgang candy. They come seasonally in the holiday seasons. Also, we have made tshirts to sell and raise money.

This year the chapter was given an opportunity to help at the National High school high steppers competition in Charlotte NC. We were given gas money and a hotel room to stay the weekend and assist with the competition. We made announcements, helped set up, helped with concessions and did some recruitment for our band. We are currently anxiously awaiting the annual Trojan Explosion day set for April 27,2013 to continue our initiatives to serve the community through our band program. Trojan explosion day is an annual initiative that brings high school students from different schools in the areas to the campus of Virginia State University for a day to see what its like to be apart of the Trojan explosion. We stress the importance of dedication, hard work and leadership. We host various forums throughout the year to promote the empowerment of women in band. In addition to our annual informal and formal informational meetings, this year we hosted a forum entitled ""Girl Talk"" where we just sit around and talk about ""girl stuff "" and our place in the band and in the world. This year we continued a tradition started just last year, this new forum was entitled ""Are you Woman Enough for the World"". The first year we had our sponsor lead the discussion on preparation for the business world and life after college. This year we asked 3 alumni members ; one who has just graduated from college a yet ago, one who has been out for 5 years and another who has been out for 10 years, to come back and talk about their experiences with life after college and give great preparation tips.

When we first hosted an interest meeting in September only 5 ladies attended the meeting. By the time we held out formal interest meeting the number had tripled. However, unfortunately due to poor final grades, only 4 young ladies qualified to participate in the membership intake classes. This year the classes were great. The ladies were properly taught the information and properly prepared to be informed of our secret. They have been able to explain what the information means to them and apply some of our principle to everyday scenarios. We had lots of sisterhood activities that allowed is to not only bond with the membership candidates but also with our alumni. We were able to learn and grow from one another. Service:

We hemmed and repaired the uniforms for Marching Band season this year during band camp. We also fit the members for their uniforms during band camp as well. We also cleaned out our instrument closet, Uniform closet and cleaned our performance center with our brother chapter, Eta Alpha. During the fall semester we cleaned along the river walkway in town, held a joint Thanksgiving dinner open to the band and raked our band director/sponsors leafs.We also just fitted uniforms for concert band after getting them cleaned.The brothers and the sisters created a joint Relay For Life team opened to the band.

Membership:

This year our chapter held our rushes during the fall semester. For rush events we had a bring your own shirt tie dye night, recreation night where we played wally ball, Walmart run, joint rush where we played a game called where the great wind blows, and a service rush where we cleaned the uniform storage closet. This year we only took a spring class. During the whole year we held study hours three times a week, for those who wished to attend. Fundraising:

Epsilon Omega

This year the Epsilon Omega chapter has been true to our purpose of service. This year we have brought two new service activities to our band; early morning wake-up calls and one on one study sessions. Our early morning wake-up calls were started during the marching band season to help promote on time attendance for early Saturday morning rehearsals and trips. Band members would sign up for a call and sisters of the active chapter would give them two courtesy calls an hour before call time. This ultimately helped improve our on time attendance. Our one on one study sessions were implemented to help promote better grades with in our band. Sisters of the active chapter would offer tutoring services to band members and they would meet at convenient times to go over troublesome material. A few of our other service activities were spirit week during band camp and Homecoming week, spirit bags, band room/instrument room clean-up, uniform maintenance, band nourishment and bus activities during travel season.

We are currently in the middle of our membership education program. Our VPM has constructed a detailed education program consisting of interactive games and activities such as Jeopardy and cross word puzzles that not only gets the Membership Candidates excited about the learning process, but it also gets the active chapter excited about the teaching process. We have increased the number of classes a week to help ensure better retention of the information being taught. The active chapter has a post education class before each MC class to better prepare ourselves for what it is to be taught. We also try to educate the non-members in the band by posting facts about the organization and members on our wall in the band hall and also by hosting informational nights.

This year our chapter has been able to gain better control of our financial responsibilities. Our treasurer has been able to effectively document and distribute the financial information providing a better understanding for the chapter. We have been able to effectively and quickly raise money through fundraisers such as candy sales and Chic-Fil-A fundraiser nights. We are currently working on music and auxiliary clinics that will be open for non-band members. We will invite students to come and experience what it is like to be apart of our band for a fee.

Zeta Omicron

The Zeta Omicron chapter has been hard at work to aid the band and the community. We've welcomed fourteen Members in Training over the course of the year, more than doubling our initial membership.

Zeta Omicron has been involved in many service projects within the Blacksburg and Virginia Tech communities. Zeta Omicron is extremely active during band camp, welcoming new students and helping the event to run smoothly. We provided a move-in service for incoming freshmen and offered refreshments to new recruits during the long, hot days of camp. Our chapter provides breakfast for the Marching Virginians on home-game days. We sort and redistribute marching uniforms after they've been cleaned, collate drill charts, and coordinate Band Parents' Day and Alumni Weekend events. During Homecoming Week, the chapter sponsored Penny Wars to raise money for the Marching for ALS campaign. Sisters sort music for the marching and concert bands, and make ourselves available to the music faculty for odd jobs around the department. We usher and stage-manage for student recitals, concerts, guest artists, and speakers in the music department. The sisters label and stuff envelopes and mailers, fold programs, and post advertisements for the music faculty. ZO is also extremely active in our annual VT Honor Band, helping to coordinate and organize the event. This year, we also provided volunteers for the Montgomery County Educational Foundation benefit concert, helping to raise over \$4,000 for public arts education.

Fundraisers have been increasingly lucrative this year, especially with merchandise sales during marching season. The chapter sells license plate covers, Band Parent polo shirts, mugs, toothpick holders, and t-shirts to the Marching Virginians and their families. We hosted spirit nights, handing out fliers to gain a percentage of restaurant sales during several evenings each semester. In April, Zeta Omicron will host Acafestapella, a collaborative concert by all of the a capella groups on campus. The chapter charges admission to the concert and helps to promote the music of the vocal ensembles. The chapter also plans to sell merchandise to brothers and sisters at convention in the Spring.

Sisterhood has been a main focus of the Zeta Omicron chapter this year. Our membership chair has led countless activities to strengthen the bond within our sisterhood. We hold a weekly workshop with the five and the eight, taking time from each chapter meeting to recognize sisters for exhibition of the ideals of Tau Beta Sigma. After our chapter meetings (while our MiTs are meeting with the VPM), sisters come together and participate in various membership and bonding activities. We did a breakdown and discussion of the preamble, analyzing the true meaning and discussing ways to implement the clauses in our daily lives. Zeta Upsilon

Membership

This year, Zeta Upsilon was charged with the duty to improve the diversity of our membership classes. In the past, we have had a great deal of color guard members, and certain sections of the band were better represented than others. We took this to heart with our Beta Delta class in Fall 2012. We initiated four wonderful Sisters (one in color guard, and three band members) and they have already made great contributions to the Sisterhood. We have began Beta Epsilon's process with twelve membership candidates (four color guard and eight band members), and it has been going well thus far. Our MC Activities are lots of fun and many Sisters attend which has helped them get to know and become more connected with the MC's.

Service

Our service projects during the Fall semester focus on assisting the marching band as much as possible. This year, we greatly improved both our joint relationship and service to the marching band by hosting the welcome back band picnic at the beginning of band camp, helping with the setup and tear down of the band field at every rehearsal and working jointly on setting up and tearing down the large rehearsal room in the music building. This year we also sponsored awards for the band banquet, including a \$250 scholarship for a deserving band member. In the Spring, we focus more on assistance with band concerts, including setup and tear down and hosting receptions after the concert. We also help run the Field of View indoor color guard show. We have also started the task of organizing the music library in our music building, which includes sorting music, making sure it is accurate and includes all parts, and cataloging it. Fundraising has continued to sell headbands throughout the year. We also sold pins at one point. We mostly sell crafts throughout the year, which could probably be expanded to do things like restaurant fundraisers and such as well.

Boston University 15 Actives, 2 Conditional

This year Eta Gamma focused on executing and evaluating Service Projects which serve the Boston University Band. At the beginning of the year 8 active Sisters undertook the task of fitting and assigning uniforms to over 90 students in the BU Marching Band. We also performed such tasks as freshmen welcome kits, first aid kits at every event, and water coolers for rehearsals. This year we were excited to be able to go on Fall Tour and Perform at the Allentown Collegiate Band Festival. Sisters were in charge of many tasks on the trip such as setting up breakfast and carrying emergency uniform parts. As we transitioned out of Marching Band season, we provided receptions at concert band concerts and performed a lot of service for our Pep Band. This year we added the service of ""Bouncer"" where we stick around in the band room prior to a game to ensure that the doors are all locked and people's belongings are secure. We also were able to provide uniform measuring and fitting service to the Winter Percussion Ensemble. Eta Gamma is excited to soon be executing some outside community service at a local elementary school as well as undertake the librarian responsibilities for the BU Bands.

This year we executed our biggest annual fundraiser and social event for the BU Bands, Pie Day. We also worked with our Brothers of Kappa Kappa Psi Theta Beta on an Agganis Clean Up at our local arena. This spring we are selling bracelets to our student fan section, the Dog Pound, that say ""Shippin' Up to Boston"" and we will sell stress baskets that parents can buy and we deliver to students during exam time.

Eta Gamma was fortunate enough to have 4 new members become the Alpha Lambda Class of our chapter. Rebekah Forsey, John Mazza, Lauren Wojtowicz, and Yu ""Joe"" Zhou were enthusiastic and fantastic Membership Candidates. They were initiated on December 15th after a 6 week MEP. They are now all blossoming into phenomenal Sisters in our Chapter who are eager to step up and have their voices be heard. Eta Gamma also has a successful year long Continuing Education Program that we implement. The first semester follows closely along with the information that the Membership Candidates learn during their MEP. Besides that, we sell roses and water at every band concert at the University of Rhode Island for fundraising. The chapter attempted to do a Mary Kay fundraiser. It wasn't as successful as we had hoped, but we plan to try again. We also plan to sell white and blue para-cord bracelets at the 2013 Districts Convention. If this is successful, we plan to sell more para-cords to the other students on campus. The sisters of Eta Chi all have a plethora of wonderful, crafty ideas that we cannot wait to start.

Theta Pi

The Theta Pi Chapter of Tau Beta Sigma has been thoroughly involved over the last year. We've completed service projects such as Stand By Me: Restorations of Chairs and Stands, Operation Lock It Up: Locker Maintenance, Sew 'Em Up and Button 'Em Down: Uniform Maintenance amongst many others. These programs have provided a way to keep our band, The Mighty Symphony of Soul, running like a well oiled machine.

In addition to our service projects we have created several forums/clinics to help excel our bandsmen and women to a higher level of musicianship. Examples of these programs are Arranging Music 101 Q&A and Rhythm Clinics.

Some of our biggest fundraisers of the year come from selling refreshments during the marching season before and after football games, bake sales before band concerts and raffles during the basketball season. We use some of these proceeds to provide meals for the band during events such as homecoming and to create socials such as game and movie/nacho nights.

Theta Phi

This year, the Theta Phi chapter of Tau Beta Sigma has grown in more ways imaginable. We've had a lot of positive support and feedback. With regards to service, we are fortunate to perform service on a daily basis. Everyday from 3:45-4:45 we volunteer with Sound Scapes, mentoring children on the instruments and reading music. We perform Adopt-a-Spot every other Saturday and work with the children at our daycare on campus once a week. In the midst of our off campus service, we make an effort to ask our band directors if there is anything we may assist them with.

With regards to membership, we have Fall intake at our University. We initiated 7 little sisters and they are more than eager to serve the band. Our classes are about 6 women each year and we are currently 18 active members strong. We have a strong MEP that guided us throughout our intake education.

Fundraising wise, we sell donuts at each home game and make great profit. We plan to begin our car washes with the Spring season quickly approaching.

Iota Alpha

This past year we have done several different service projects. The biggest one was helping out a local girl scout troop and doing musical activities with them. We are trying to establish another project with a local elementary school to help out at a concert, either playing or being ushers. we are trying to branch out and help as often as possible. We also participate in relay for life every year, and have a joint service project with another club on campus in the works. A active sister is a member of the club we are trying to work with, and hopefully everything goes as planned.

Fundraising has been an issue for us because of the way the college handles our accounts. We do not have the power to save money for the next year. Most of our funds are allocated and we are only allowed 2 fundraisers a semester. At the end of the year, our accounts are zeroed out.

SERVICE: Our year begins with band camp, when we put together the drill binders for all of the band members before the first full day of camp. On the days that we work on marching, Sisters hand out freeze pops as the band members file onto the buses after practice. Over the course of band camp we also help the band directors with odd jobs that need to be done. During the marching season, most Sisters hold leadership positions and assist the band on a personal level as we are available. We also participate in a pop tab collecting competition, where, if the band wins, the prize money is used to purchase items that the band needs over the course of the season, such as the binders for band camp. Some long term projects we've been working on are the creation of a digital CD catalogue, ushering at concerts for the music department, and assisting the band directors with ""Festival Fridays""--a program for high school band students at UVA. We hold various workshops and forums to discuss topics of business etiquette, leadership qualities, and communication. These workshops not only helped our newly insisted sisters, but many of our fellow band members.

We have had a number of service projects such as band room clean up day where we completely clean the band room from top to bottom. we also distributed out band uniforms, polish instruments, collect clothes for victims of hurricane sandy and many other things. Our fundraisers this year have been extremely fun. We have continued to host our annual Walking Taco sale but this time we incorporated our infamous smoothies on campus. We have also hosted bake sales and 50/50 raffles, Valentines raffle and much more.

We are excited to have four membership candidates this semester. We are currently in the process of our Membership classes. In order to help our MC's learn and understand our wonderful history and information. We re-purposed the Jeopardy game show format to assist members and candidates with learning Tau Beta Sigma and chapter history. We encourage writing daily experiences in a journal to state how the ideals of Tau Beta Sigma relates to your everyday life.
